


Our bedroom. The building dates back to the 1550s; even before Vermeer lived in the neighborhood.




Living room/ Dining room. Of course the new furniture comes from Ikea. Holland has over 20 including one in Delft.








Amsterdam has a special barge that goes around picking up bicycles (and cars?) from the canals. I don't know whether Delft has such a barge.
